

MAKING A MOVIE OF YOUR PLACE

A story of your place, what makes this place YOUR place, what do you like, what do you not? what catches your eye and why?

Ages: Key Stages 2 - 4

Class size: Maximum 25 - 30

Duration: One day

Cost: £200 + travel expenses

Key processes include:

Art and Design - working independently, with imagination; careful observation; interpretation and evaluation; communication of feelings; contemporary technology, exploring new medium and methods; use of different equipment, consideration of safe working practices; 3D space in to 2D representation; own location and environment ; collaboration and encouragement of each other.

Geography – place; geographical imaginations of places and those that live there; networks and connections – political and physical, flow of people and goods; sustainable development, cultural considerations.

Details:

This workshop is about place, urban/natural, day-to-day, local, taken for granted. It's about re-engaging with what is around us, and taken for granted. It is about looking, again, at what we have missed, but what catches our eye and intrigues us and wants to make us tell our story to others.

The day will start with a discussion about 'place'. Students will then walk their environment (under supervision), with digital cameras. The students will notice their individual responses to their place, taking photographs as they walk, maybe it will be of people, a discarded shoe, a shopping trolley, a favourite tree...Students will be asked to edit their photographs to 10 each.

In the afternoon we will pull these images in to imovie and create a DVD of everyone's images, all students work will be in sequence and will make a coherent story.

This workshop encourages students to look closely at where they come from, what makes their identity special, their and other's cultural differences, how they belong and are part of the landscape.
